A current full schedule is not quite as intense as it used to be in years gone by. The Lord has graciously met our every need.

Meanwhile Spring has sprung here. Well, maybe not quite, but the tulips are underway. We are delighted to experience another time of newness of life. We wish you and yours a Blessed Resurrection Day with the joy of the Risen Lord in full measure.

We thank you for your fellowship in the gospel and for giving us the privilege of serving the Lord Jesus Christ and His people. We surely need you to stand with us!
